# MPO Accomplishments in FFY 2018 (FFYs 2019–23 TIP)

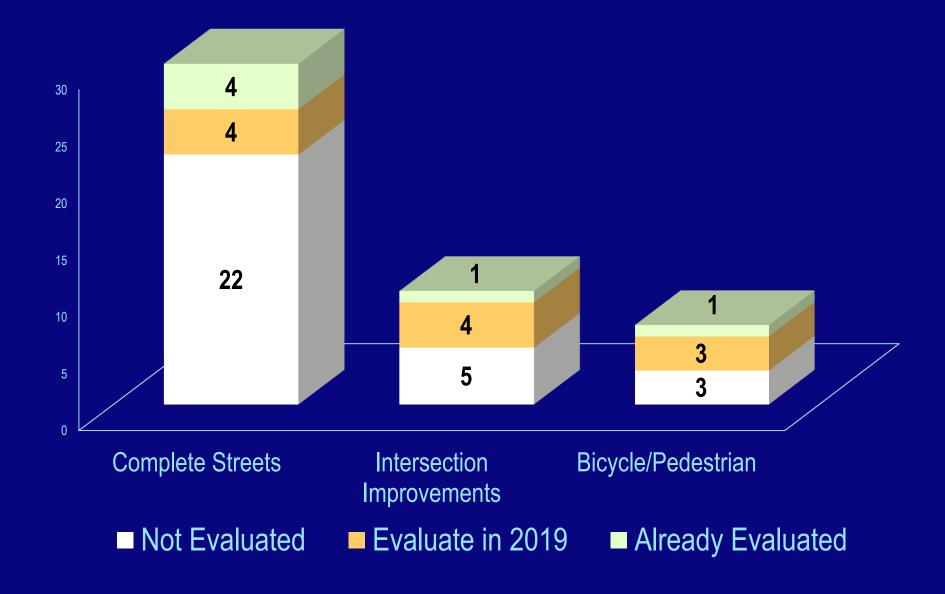
- Programmed 12 new projects
- 9 Complete Streets projects; 3 Intersection Safety projects
- Representing 7 out of 8 Total Subregions
- Average cost = \$5.7 million

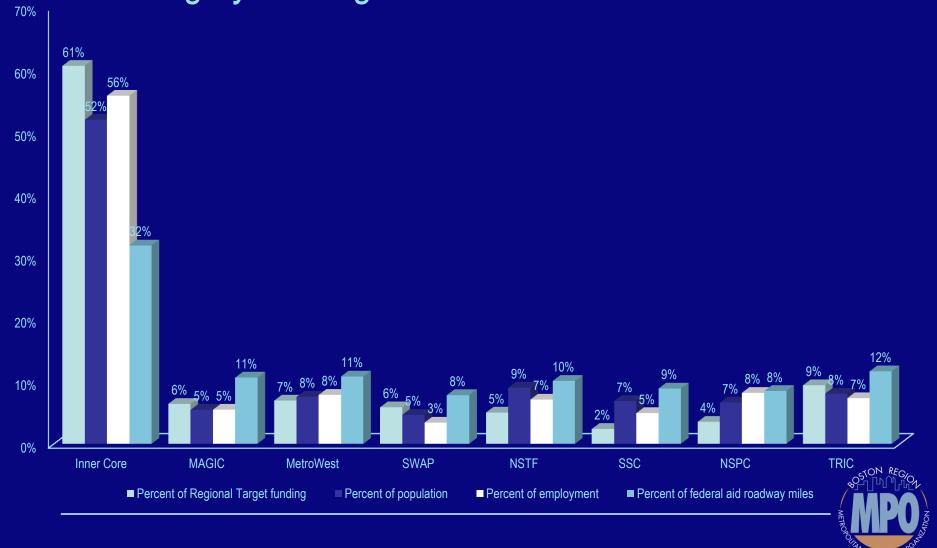

  - 4 Safe Routes to School
