She also shared that the MPO was awarded a new Safe Streets and Roads for All award: *Safety Forward* with \$5 million in federal funding with a \$1.25 million state match.

C. Allen-Connelly shared her support for continued exploration around roadway pricing and asked about advancing roadway pricing initiatives in FFY 2027. T. Teich responded that is being developed as part of UPWP development, and Rebeca Morgan shared that another discrete study is planned for FFY 2027 that would advance this work.
